Submissions and pre-registration open

We are delighted to announce that, starting on 1st September 2025, submissions are open for the ERME topic conference, *Connecting the Learning of Mathematics Teaching to Practice*. This conference will take place from 4th to 7th February 2026 in Prague (Czech Republic). There will be pre and post sessions for early career researchers (https://etc2026.pedf.cuni.cz/programme/).

The conference will foster the ERME commitments to communication, cooperation, and collaboration amongst researchers in mathematics education. Plenary events will include talks by Deborah Loewenberg Ball (United States) and Despina Potari (Greece).

We welcome diverse theoretical, methodological, empirical, and developmental papers relevant to the scope and focus of the conference. Although brief, please try to be explicit about the context of your study and the terminology you use related to practice. We aim for a discussion where we share our growing understanding and raise cross-study questions, warranting claims in relation to teaching and the learning of practice.

Paper submission and conference registration will be administered through Conftool (https://www.conftool.org/etc2026/). Each participant can be a submitting author of one paper and a co-author of at most one other paper. We recommend that the submitting author be the one to present the paper at the conference. Others interested in attending the conference may register as users in Conftool; the decision about their attendance will be made after reviews. All details regarding the registration found the website submission and processes can be on conference https://etc2026.pedf.cuni.cz.

Only original papers that have not been published or submitted elsewhere will be considered. Please see the conference website (https://etc2026.pedf.cuni.cz/submissions/) for the template and author guidelines. Note that a non-refundable 50 euro pre-registration fee is required for each submission.

We are planning for about 80 participants, and the two criteria for acceptance will be: (i) relevance to the conference topic; and (ii) quality of the submission. The papers will be peer-reviewed by two other authors. Submitting authors will be asked to review at most two papers, and co-authors may be asked to review as well. The conference leaders will decide on acceptance.

Paper submission and user registration closes on 19th September 2025.

We look forward to seeing you at the conference in Prague in February 2026!
